# WISE PROVOCATIONS-LAUNCHING THIS MONTH

Supporting the public and key decision-makers to understand our complex work



Earlier this year, we wrote to you about the elephant in the room.

We discussed the biggest threat to the future of general practice- that key decision makers don't understand what general practice is and does.

Following a <u>WiseGP Action Group</u> meeting, we shared a survey to help understand the unique essence of our work and the misunderstandings about general practice that need to be challenged. Thank you to everyone who shared their thoughts. We're excited to tell you that following a successful application to the <u>University of Hull HIKE fund</u>, we now have the funding to progress this work to the next step!

Contributions from you, the many WiseGPs working tirelessly to deliver care nationally, have enabled us to develop two draft messages to improve understanding of what general practice is and does- one for the public, and one for policy makers and senior managers. Building on the

BMA's campaign, 'GPs are on your side', our own campaigns will challenge more of the myths out there that stop us making the changes needed to sustain general practice.



#### **Provocation Events**

Next, we'll be holding two provocation events, meetings to challenge misconceptions about general practice. GPs, members of the public, policy makers and managers will all be invited to attend, to discuss, challenge and build on our draft messages. We'll then work with a communications team to translate our stories into powerful video messages. Once complete, we'll share these with the public and the key people who have the power to make a positive difference.
